What Courage Is

The five truths we learned about courage can be summed up like this: *Courage is doing the right thing even when it's hard or you are afraid.*

There's a verse that reminds me of this definition.



The wicked flee when no one pursues, but the righteous are bold as a lion. (Proverbs 28:1 *ESV*)

Everyone is afraid sometimes, but people who don't trust in God can get so scared they run even when they don't need to! But when you are doing the right thing—that is to say, when you are righteous—you are bold like a lion!

Then Miriam the prophetess, the sister of Aaron, took a tambourine in her hand, and all the women went out after her with tambourines and dancing. (Exodus 15:20 *ESV*)

Miriam was a *prophetess*. That meant that she was a woman who spoke God's Word. She considered what He said to be true. And she knew about His covenant promise. And she taught other people what she learned. Why? Because she believed it!

To be called a prophetess was a *very* special honor! In fact, there are not many women in the Bible who got to use this title.

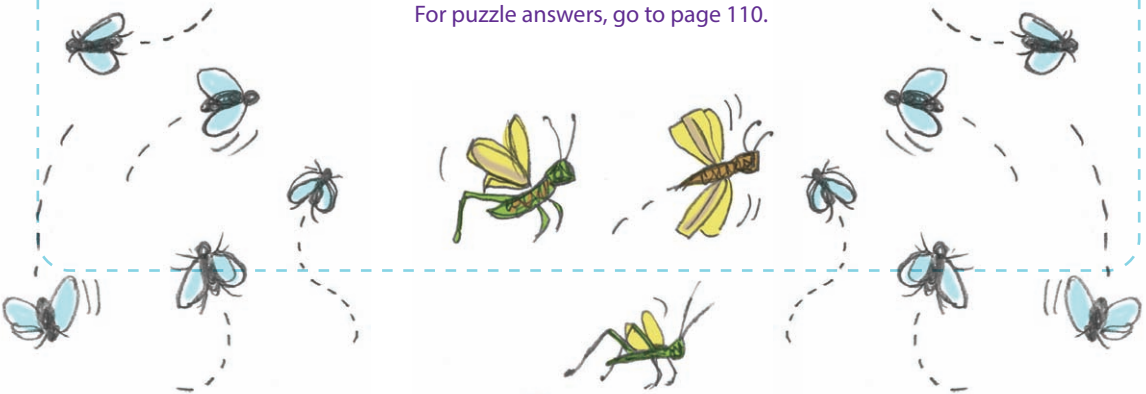
